Ms. Donna M. Rodriguez is a native of Quezon Province, located south of the Philippine capital Manila. Born in 1977, she joined the Department of Foreign Affairs in 1997, after passing the examination for Foreign Service Officers.

Since joining the Department of Foreign Affairs, Ms. Rodriguez has served as Principal Assistant at the Office of Asian and Pacific Affairs (ASPAC) from 1998 to 2001, and as Acting Director in ASPAC in 2003, as Director at the Office of the United Nations and Other International Organizations (UNIO) from 2009 to 2011, and as Director at the Office of ASEAN Affairs (ASEAN) from 2018 until June 2021.

Abroad, Ms. Rodriguez was assigned as Second Secretary and Consul to the Philippine Embassy in Moscow from 2003 to 2007, as First Secretary, Alternate Permanent Representative to ESCAP and Consul to the Philippine Embassy in Bangkok from 2007 to 2009, as First Secretary and Consul, and later on as Minister and Consul at the Philippine Embassy in Beijing from 2013 to 2015. Her last foreign assignment prior to her current post was to the Philippine Embassy in Berlin, where she served as Deputy Chief of Mission from 2015 to 2018.

Ms. Rodriguez arrived in Washington, D.C. in 2021, where she served as the head of the Political and Legislative Section of the Philippine Embassy until June 2024. She is currently assigned as Minister and Consul General, where she heads the Consular Section of the Embassy.

Ms. Rodriguez graduated Magna Cum Laude in 1996 at the age of 19 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science from the University of the Philippines, Diliman. She was also a scholar

of the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) from 2001 to 2003, where she obtained her Master's degree in International Development Studies from the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies in Tokyo. She obtained a second Master's degree in National Security Administration from the National Defense College of the Philippines in 2020. She also holds the rank of Commander at the Philippine Naval Reserve Command.
